Now that EVERY bike is eligible for at least TWO different classes, we have produced this table to help you see the most suitable class to enter. Column 1 shows a whole range of bikes for which we now have a race class. Look down this list to see where your bike fits in. Then look across to column 2 to see your Principal Race Class, that is the one where your bike should be most competitive, and that should be your first choice of class to enter. Column 3 shows the optional class or classes you can enter to double your track time, and in many cases, still be highly competitive. The choice is yours!
